

In 2015 Ballyhoura Development

delivered €5.7 million of public funding to support communities, individuals and businesses across the Ballyhoura area. Projects supported were in line with the company mission and vision to create a diversified economy and support improved quality of living in the area.

In 2015... 670 groups and 5,926 individuals engaged with Ballyhoura Development.

- ✓ 25 community, enterprise and environmental projects received grant aid.
- ✓ €0.5m invested in these projects created an additional investment of €170,000.
- ✓ 1,090 males and 835 females participated in training and learning activities.
- ✓ 79 people received major QQI awards.
- ✓ 259 people progressed to work and 152 to further education and training.
- ✓ 170 people availed of Ballyhoura Mentoring and Start Your Own Business services.
- ✓ 82 people were supported into self-employment.
- ✓ 32 new jobs were created and sustained by supported entrepreneurs.

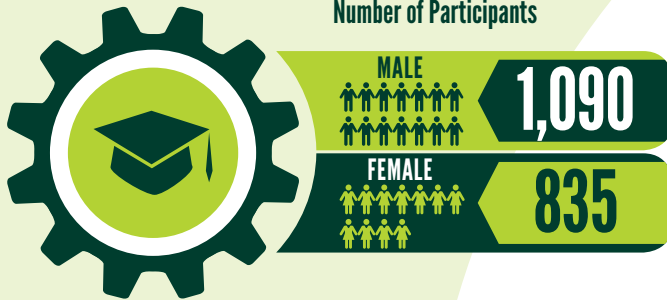

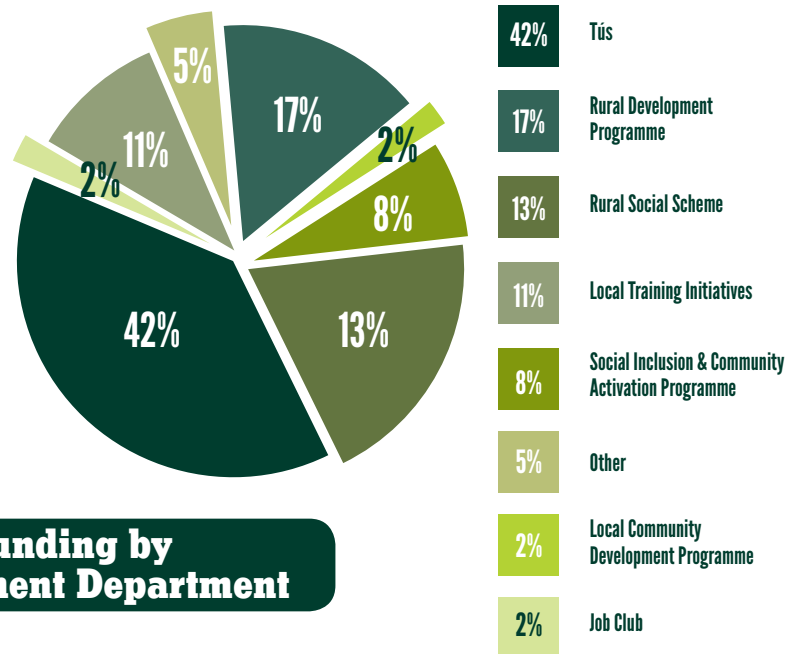

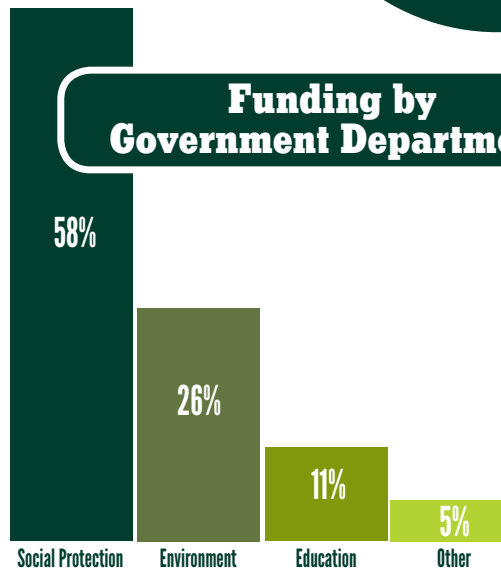
Number of Participants



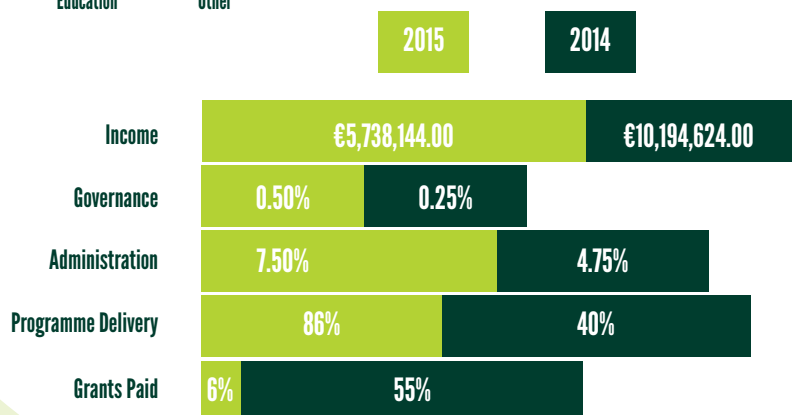
Funding by Programme
