

In 2017 Ballyhoura Development

delivered €4.7m of public funding to support communities, individuals and businesses across the Ballyhoura area. Services delivered were in line with the company mission and vision to create a diversified and sustainable economy and to support improved inclusion and quality of living across the area.

A snapshot of Ballyhoura Development's activities in 2017...

- ✓ 565 groups and 4617 individuals engaged with Ballyhoura Development
- ✓ 92 % of the funding was spent on service delivery
- ✓ 930 men and 879 women participated in training and learning activities
- ✓ 202 individuals engaged with the Ballyhoura Business Mentoring and Start Your Own Business Services
- ✓ 194 people progressed to work and a further 590 people progressed to further education and training
- ✓ 713 'non-liners' received practical IT training
- ✓ 667 children participated in targeted activities
- ✓ 105 people received accredited QQI awards
- ✓ 41 individuals progressed to self employment

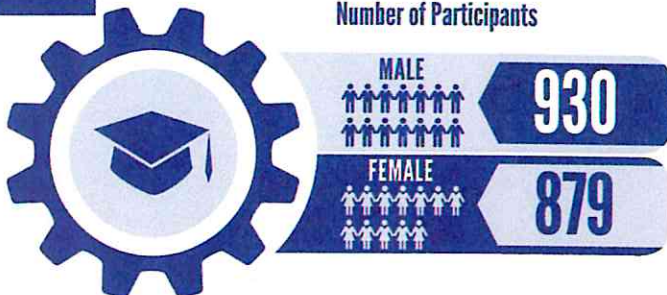

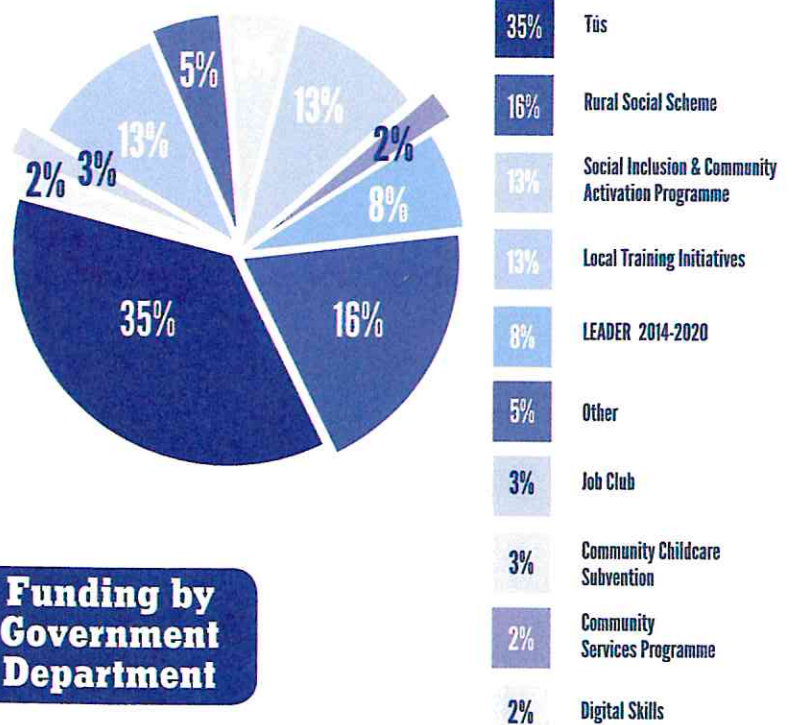

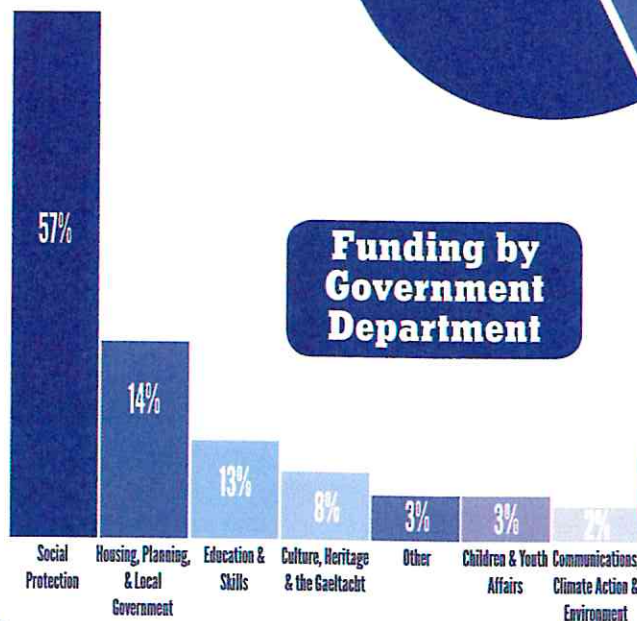

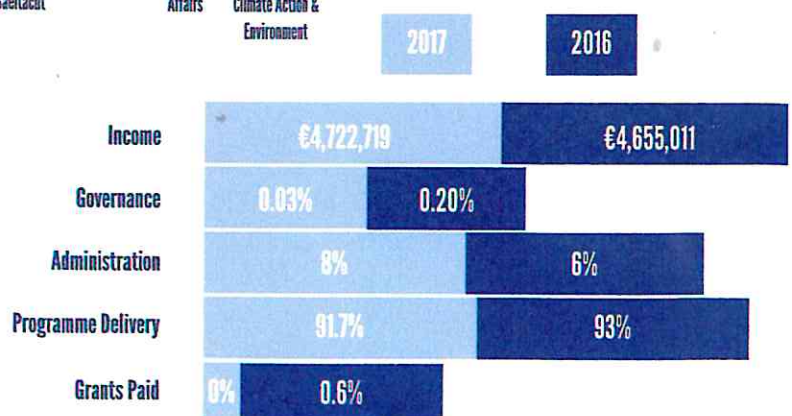
Funding by Programme



Funding by Government Department

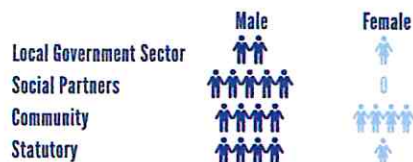


How funding supported Local Development Activities
